Diana Wolf 24 May 2024 "Fusion of Forms: Human-Animal Hybridity in LBA Seals"

Abstract: This presentation begins with an introduction to Aegean seals, providing an overview of human-animal hybrid iconography during the Bronze Age. It will explore theoretical concepts of hybridity, illustrated with archaeological examples from Minoan Crete and the Mycenaean mainland. Given the prominence of human-animal hybrids in the Late Bronze Age, a detailed case study of artifacts from this period will examine the social and cognitive contexts in which these hybrids developed and functioned. This aims to provide a foundation for productive discussions on gender and bodies in the Aegean Bronze Age in the wider workshop context.
